We would both like to wish Mark, Jenny, Harry and Dulcie all the very best of luck in the 'new look' Whimple Stores. If you haven't been in yet, do pop in and take a look around, you will be sure of a warm welcome, and a lovely fresh loaf of bread (the cakes are rather nice too !!)

If you have posted a parcel here in the last few weeks you may be wondering why we have had to ask you what your parcel contains? We are not being nosey!!! Royal Mail are now being very particular about what items are being sent through the post. Some everyday items do come under the category of 'dangerous goods', and some 'restricted'. So, if you are posting anything (either inland or overseas) we will ask you what your package contains. We have leaflets available for your information.

As a rough guide-

Overseas – Batteries (well packaged and attached to a device) - restricted Aerosols, spirits, nail varnish, perfume, loose batteries, lighters - prohibited.

<u>Inland</u> – Aerosols, electronics, nail varnish, perfumes, and spirits - restricted. Loose batteries, compressed gas, lighters etc - prohibited.

We are now offering you the opportunity to play the Health Lottery. It is still £1.00 to play and the draws take place on Wednesdays and Saturdays. The National Lottery introduce some changes to its Lotto game on Saturday 5th October which will mean bigger jackpots and more chances to win, but the price of the tickets will rise to £2.00.

You can now book National Express Coach tickets from our office.

Please help us to raise money for Children In Need this year by buying (and wearing) a Pudsey Bear Paw print tattoo which we will be selling in our branch ready for November 8th when you will, hopefully, find something interesting going on in the Post Office that day.

We would like to say a huge thank you to so many of you who have offered us support and encouragement during our first few weeks at the shop.

We have been overwhelmed by many things. The amount of work involved and the new things we have to learn have been much more than we had expected and we must thank Graham for all his help. Most of all we have been overwhelmed by the kindness and support from our friends and neighbours. The Betts, Bunkums, Sharkeys, Cossletts and Bowdens have been behind us in these early days with hammers, dusters, muscles and hugs. Without their help and time we would not have been able to get so far as we have so quickly. We are hugely touched by their care and hugely grateful.

As well as their time and support we have also had many others who have helped and we are hugely grateful to you all. Whether you cleaned, scraped, helped unload the stock or supplied us with cake – Laurel your cakes are delicious – we are very grateful. We can't forget Jim and Alison who have also encouraged us with cakes, kindness and good, helpful advice.

For those who have been in shopping, you will see that we have tried to keep stocking what Graham and Karen had supplied in the past and the same milk, eggs and bread that Jim and Alison had supplied. We have added some things that we hope will be useful and we have been particularly pleased to add fruit and veg. Thanks to Rosie we have had a weekly supply of veg from Broadclyst Community Farm and Len Luck, Sue Wilson and others have been very kind to us and we have been delighted to sell delicious local produce. We hope to offer some kind of community shelves for people to sell their own goods, but we need to investigate this further. At the moment we are giving most of the money back to growers, keeping 5% for the shop and giving 5% to local projects. Some produce is being donated fully and all of this is going to local projects. This is a bit cumbersome at busy times so we may need to refine this over the coming weeks.

We hope to keep offering the convenience goods you are likely to run out of and fresh produce you need on a daily basis. When we are more organised we hope to be able to offer fresh fish on a Wednesday when the fish man comes. He is suggesting he is phoned on Tuesday. So, if you wish to place orders we will keep it ready for your collection. Hopefully also fresh meat – orders will be taken for those not around during the day. We hope to offer special days one day a week, when you can buy all the ingredients you need to make a quick meal – this will hopefully happen as we get more organised as it will take some time to prepare.

Milk is predominantly coming from Ashclyst Dairy. It is organic and not homogenised, which makes it really creamy and delicious. They also offer cream and yoghurt which means we have a great local product that is grown and processed within a few miles of Whimple.

We are carrying on with the newspapers and magazines seven days a week and are happy to take orders for this, milk or bread.



This is all quite a lot to organise for starters. We would love, in a few months time, to add a few tables and chairs and a really nice coffee machine as well as a craft hub for Whimple's wonderful talented crafters. All of this would be subject to planning consent so may take some time to sort out.

Hopefully we can provide something for everyone at a reasonable price. This depends on the supplier prices which can go up and down with each order – especially the fruit and veg. We are trying to order fresh milk and bread daily and fresh fruit and veg every other day. We hope to stock enough daily requirements for everyone but please bear with us if it takes a while to get this right. Last week we were selling out of fruit and veg but not bread and this week it is the other way around. The less waste we have, the better prices we can offer. So hopefully we can provide a consistent product with consistent demand. We are trying to test out all products – especially the cakes – but if you have any problems with anything you buy from us, please let us know.

We are finding ourselves in need of a break during the day so we will be closing between 2.00 - 3.00pm Monday to Friday. Otherwise our opening hours are 7.30am - 2.00pm and 3.00 - 6.15pm Monday to Friday and Saturday 8.00am - 1.00pm and Sunday 9.00am - 1.00pm. We may review this in the future depending on demand.

Finally for now, we wish Graham, Karen and the family all the very best for the future and thank them for all their work at the shop in the past. We hope they can enjoy good health and happiness in their new home.



8th June 1944 - 13th September 2013

Marion was the centre of my life for forty two wonderful years. Oh! if only I could have had many more. I miss her so very much and I feel rudderless without her.

A local girl, she was born in Sidmouth, grew up in the Sid valley and went to The King's School in Ottery St Mary. From there she won a place at The London School of Economics where she obtained a very good honours degree in Economics. We met at work four years later and never looked back from that time on.

Marion was formidably well organised, clever, imaginative, and versatile and possessed both an inquiring mind and a powerful intellect. She was interested in everything and everybody in the world and even shared my passion for railways (which was a great asset as we lived in a Railway Station!). At the same time she was the most gentle, caring and loving person who made the most perfect home for me and the children whilst we lived in both the 'North' and in Letchworth, Hertfordshire. In our time together she always supported and encouraged me in the many things that I attempted to achieve in my life with her

When we came back to Devon nine years ago, amongst other things, we joined the Devon Association where she made an immediate impression, quickly becoming involved in this organisation and its activities in Devon. She rapidly became an officer in several branches in which roles she will be sadly missed. In addition, she took on the editorship of the National Trust magazine Devon Oakleaves which she made a similar success of. In fact, she refused to go to hospital until she had completed what, sadly became her last edition. At a personal level, we loved to travel and had explored most of the world together. At the same time we had plans for places never visited which I will now never get to, as I shall not go on my own without her.

Marion is survived by her loving mother, our loving children and their partners and the grandchildren all of whom are a great strength to me in coping with the loss of my lovely girl. We, as a family, thank our many friends and neighbours for their support and sympathy over the length of her final illness and its awful aftermath.

Whimple District Councillor's Report More delay on the New Local Plan?

Planning have received a letter from the Inspector who is handling E.D. D. C's application in response to his receiving of the draft local plan which looks as though there will be even further delay to the sanctioning of the plan. The inspector has presented to the Council a list of 53 amendments that the Council had made to the plan which



they (the Council) considered were minor and would not require public scrutiny. Unfortunately, the Inspector disagrees and states that it would not be in the interests of natural justice for him to consider these proposed changes unless they are subject to consultation in accordance with the 'Council's Statement of Community Involvement and Regulations'.

If further consultation needs to take place this could possibly means some months of delay whilst that consultation occurs, which is a pity because the plan is already substantially late and more delay means more months of the dominance of the N.P.P.F. (National Planning Policy Framework) in the planning process.

The Solar Panel Blight.

- 1. At the August planning meeting there was an application on land north of Crannaford House between Broadclyst and Whimple for a large scale (27.9 hectares) solar farm which was approved. There are already five solar farms either in or near the vicinity of Whimple because of the proximity of the area to the electricity station on the Whimple Broadclyst road which allows easy transmitting of the electricity created to the National Grid.
- 2. At the September planning meeting the members will be contemplating another application from Pithayes farm at Hand and Pen for a similarly sized solar farm. I sensed at the August planning meeting that Councillors are beginning to question this proliferation of solar farms as our district becomes saturated with them. Consequently, it will be interesting to see if this coming application is accepted or not.

Update on The Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) Task Force

The community infrastructure Levy Task Force (TAFF) has completed its deliberations and presented its report to the last planning meeting. Amongst its recommendations is the proposal to set up a new panel to focus on the consideration of strategic planning and economic development issues. This will have to be considered carefully to determine how it would sit alongside the role of the Development Management Committee which currently considers such issues. Formal decision making on the deployment of monies would continue to rest with Cabinet. The report also states that decisions on the mechanisms to deliver CIL will lie with the Cabinet.

S106 Agreements - viability and overage.

S106 agreements secure benefits to militate against the impact of development proposals. Given the present economic climate the Council is facing increasing pressure from developers to reduce or waive mitigating benefits (S106 agreements) in order for their development to remain viable. This is having a bad effect upon the development of affordable housing as developers apply to have their obligation reduced or cancelled. By introducing an overage clause into S106 agreements it would ensure that in the event of the circumstances of a development changing because of the unviability of that development if it should subsequently make a profit then the Council will recover part of that profit in compensation for the lost S106 contribution.

Concerts for your Diary

Classics Galore - November 9th -Great Hall, Exeter

Christmas Concert - December 14th Ottery Parish Church

CHRISTMAS CONCERT At the beginning of September the Choral Society began rehearsals for their next concert. Although Christmas still seems a long way off at this point, plenty of rehearsal time is always useful to produce a varied programme of Christmas music as well as a major choral work. This year the society will be performing Haydn's **Great Organ Mass** as well as a selection of Christmas carols. Tickets will be available in November from Stagestruck in Ottery St Mary.

CLASSICS GALORE CONCERT. This year Ottery Choral will also be preparing for Classics Galore on 9th November. This event is staged every two years and since 2007 it has raised more than £35,000 for Force, the local cancer charity. It is now established as one of Exeter's largest indoor concerts, attracting well over a thousand people each time. The concert is specially arranged for those with an interest in the lighter side of classical music. Each item is around seven or eight minutes long and is usually immediately recognisable.

Ottery St Mary Choral Society has taken part in this musical extravaganza for the previous three concerts and members are delighted to have the chance of doing so again in 2013. We will be joined by many more singers including St David's Players from Exeter, as well as soloists Penny Daw (soprano) and Mark Hurford (tenor). Lympstone SWT Brass Band will also be participating for the first time. The show will feature a specially selected Classics Galore Symphony Orchestra, comprising 50 top musicians from Exeter and East Devon. The stage at the Great Hall will be extended to accommodate more than 200 musicians and singers, all following the baton of Ottery St Mary Choral Society's renowned musical director Malcolm Matthews .

"It takes a lot of organization but it's so worthwhile," said Malcolm. "I just love making music and to be able to do it on this kind of scale is fantastic. A CONVERSATION WITH LUCY SMITH

During our previous chats, Lucy had shown me some photos of what was called the 'Rainbow Revue' which was performed in the Victory Hall by a small team of villagers, just after the war for some ten years. Apparently the Rainbow Revue was started by members of the Whimple Cricket Club around 1945, with a group who used to go carol singing locally. This group of carol singers would travel as far as Ottery, Cullompton, Sidmouth and Exeter with their singing, and would travel in style in a borrowed lorry from either Hansfords, Lewis' or Whiteways. Lucy remembers finishing in Exeter at May's Fish and Chip shop at the top of Sidwell street – this is where they would 'cash up' their takings and celebrate with fish and chips whilst they were there – it would be rude not to, wouldn't it?

The Rainbow team had a number of good musicians who could knock out a decent tune on piano and accordion – Bill Potter was known as a useful pianist, and he teamed up with Den Watts and Den Clapp. Other people from the village joined in, to either be on the stage or to help behind the scenes. For some it continued the momentum of the carol singing at Christmas, and thus created some diversion for the dark winter months until the next cricket season.

A typical show would last for a couple of hours, and would be made up of songs, dances, music and individual offerings like Lucy's husband Eric, doing his 'Yorkshire Monologues'.

The show would be held over two or three nights in the Victory Hall, with the Post Office selling the tickets. Every show would be a sell-out (how envious am I with my panto hat on!) – you have to remember that a lack of transport meant that the village was truly a 'captive audience'. On the last night, they would have an 'End of Revue party' in the hall, and cast and helpers would bring their own food and drink and celebrate another successful production.

If you look at the photos that Lucy has loaned me, you can admire all the costumes, props and scenery – and the legs of the ladies of Whimple. A lot more skin than in pantos of today (apart from John Griffiths!) – well done them! The legs of the ladies had make-up applied, to give the appearance of a sun tan, and then at the end of the performance, they had a large water trough – as used for cattle - in the billiard room of the hall, where they would wash it all off again.

Lucy is in all 3 photos – and here's hoping I've got all these details right – apologies if I have made an error -

- ❖ In the Ferry Boat Inn scene, Lucy is the young lady kneeling at the front on the right hand side of the stage, with Sheila Lovering last on the right, and Joyce Hansford the left hand lady of the middle couple holding crossed swords.
- ❖ In the row of dancers, Lucy is second in from the right, with Joyce Hansford fifth from the right, and Sheila Lovering third from the left
- ❖ In the Gypsy scene, Lucy is third in from the right, with Olga Potter on her left. Sheila Lovering is the second from the left of the two ladies kneeling.

Eric would help with the scenery, and Bill Hitchcock was the stage manager and head scenery maker. Costumes were in the skilled hands of Lucy's mum and Olga Potter. Lucy can remember a Scottish theme that demanded sporrans, and her mum very creatively had some old cord which she had to 'unthread' and then comb out to make the hairy decoration (technical term here!). That's dedication for you.

When they held their dress rehearsals, they invited the people from St Loyes so that they had an audience, rather than performing to an empty hall, and Lucy can remember taking the Revue to St Loyes itself.

The Revue lasted for some ten years but petered out as people got older, and that style of entertainment didn't attract the younger people in the village. I am pleased that the Whimpletons have re-kindled that creativity in Whimple and can carry the Rainbow Revue torch, in a slightly different form, for a long time yet.



YOUR VILLAGE NEEDS YOU - Can you help? 2014 will mark 100 years of the start of the First World War.

The History Society, like many other towns and villages across the country would like to put together a picture of life in our community before, during and after the Great War.

We are looking for individuals to help research the lives of those involved in the conflict.

We would like volunteers to choose at least one name from our war memorial, and other sources, and research that person's family and military history. Some information is already known and there are some moving stories to be told. One such story is that of Henry Shepard, born into a family of thatchers on 24th January 1898. He was a member of The Whimple Scout Troop and his family lived in The Green. At the outbreak of WW1 Henry was just 16 years old. However, he was quick to be involved and enlisted into the navy joining HMS Viknor as a First Class Boy. Sadly, the ship was sunk in the Irish Sea on 13th January 1915 with the loss of all those on board – Henry's body was never recovered. He was 11 days shy of his 17th Birthday when his mother Flora received the news of her son's death.

A picture of Henry Shepard can be found in the Heritage Centre.

It would be great to piece together the lives of all those from Whimple who fought in the Great War - but we do need your help. If you are happy to research a name you will be offered help by members of the History Society plus others expert in research and searching military records. We aim to display your findings in an exhibition at the Heritage Centre next year. PLEASE HELP – contact us by email Info@whimple.org. Although the 2013 Flower Show will not go down as a record-breaking Show, it certainly had the usual very high standards of exhibits. The Judges were once again well impressed by the standard in all the classes. A wonderful array was on display. Although there were slight fewer exhibitors this year, there was a welcome increase in the number of exhibits which was a great relief.

As in previous years, it was a difficult task for the judge with so many excellent photographs in all of the classes. The standard seems to get higher every year in this section and there were some amazing entries. The overall winner in this section winning the Paul Henry G.C. Memorial Cup once again was Gilly Curtis. The Arts and Crafts Classes had another wonderful display of skills. The winner in this section of both the Len Rose Memorial Cup and the Whimple Craft Cup was Jenny Sanders.

The flower arranging had an increase in exhibits from 2012 and there were some very colourful and imaginative arrangements. In this section the Frances Pratt Cup was awarded to Margaret Bucknell. The Roy Horsburgh Trophy was won by Sherril Olive and what can we say about the winner of the Marie Louise Grout Cup for the best exhibit in the Flower arrangement as voted for by everyone who came to see the Show? It certainly showed us a different side to the Whimple Postmaster General whose magnificent exhibit clearly impressed everyone who came to the Show. So hearty congratulations to Jim Creasy for his entry in the men only flower arranging class, 'Some Like it Hot'. The Sandfords Cup which is for the combined Men Only Classes of a floral arrangement and a Banana Cake was jointly won by Nick Macklin, Branco Love and Jim Creasy.

The Homecraft section was full of excellent mouth watering entries and the snooker table was positively overloaded with tasty exhibits. There were cakes and jams galore! The judge did wonder just how she was going to get through them all! There was a new winner of the Sir Henry Imbert-Terry Cup this year so congratulations to Jane Tancock on her success in this section.

The Pot Plant Section had a good number of exhibits with all the classes well supported. The winner of the Briar Shield this year was Colin Northcott.

Last, but by no means least, there was a good number of entries in the flower and vegetable classes. This was another testing growing season for the exhibitors in these classes with the cold spring followed by a very hot spell, but it was good to see all the classes were well supported. These classes were somewhat dominated by one exhibitor, and with twelve first prizes it was not difficult to work out who was going to win the cups in this section! The Slewton Cup for the most points in the vegetable section was won by Colin Northcott and the runner winning the Cranny Cup was Paul Wilson.

In the Flower Classes, the winner of the Win and Bob Shepherd Cup for the most points in this section was Colin Northcott and the runner up winning the President's Cup was Steve Higginson. However, when all the classes were combined and the points in both sections were added together, it was not too difficult to see that the winner of The Whimple Folk Cup was Colin Northcott. So many congratulations to him on winning this magnificent trophy.

And then there was the Whimple Challenge Cup which was the fourth year of this venture. This year we chose a different subject matter and the theme was a character made from flowerpots! The exhibits certainly showed a lot of skill in how they were so cleverly put together and the judges had a hard job selecting the winner. However, after much deliberation, The Village Challenge Cup was awarded to the VPA and Flip Flop Tours took the runners up Trophy.

All the prizes were presented by Alison Creasy and the Show Committee was very grateful to her for doing this.

We would like to thank and congratulate all of you who made the effort to enter the Show for without you there would be no Show! We are also extremely grateful to all our judges who give up their time for this difficult task. 



Guy Fawkes Day

Now is the time that pet owners should be thinking about taking steps to prepare and protect their pet from fireworks.

It is a time of explosive celebrations that can cause terror for dogs, cats and rabbits. There are several things that can be done to make it as stress free as possible.

Most dogs have a favourite place to go and hide. If not you need to create a hideaway where he (or she) can feel safe. A room that is quiet and has minimal windows is the most suitable. Installing an AdaptilTM diffuser close to the refuge area may encourage him to settle, feel relaxed and confident. This should be done two weeks prior to the expected stress.

Provide blankets for him to hide under and burrow. A woolly jumper that has your scent on can be comforting. Close curtains to block out flashes of light and as much of the sound as possible. Take your dog out for a walk an hour before the expected stress to go to the toilet and feed him an early evening meal to help him feel relaxed. A meal high in carbohydrates such as pasta or rice is ideal. Play some background music that your dog normally hears, or leave the television on.

Offer chews and treats to your dog in his hiding place. He will then see this hiding place as a good place to go, and he can chew on these to relieve his tension.

Ignore the sounds of the fireworks yourself and do not soothe or comfort your dog. It may be difficult to do this but it is the worst thing to do. It gives your dog the impression that there is something to be frightened of and rewards him for being scared.

Cats need to be confined to the house and provided with a litter tray. They also need a hideaway where they can feel safe. Plugging a Feliway™ diffuser in can help them relax and relieve stress. Ideally this should be plugged in 4 weeks before the anticipated stress, so the beginning of October.

If your pet gets particularly distressed we recommend you talk to your vet about short acting medication. Old-fashioned sedatives have been replaced with modern anti anxiety drugs which help treat the problem, rather than just mask it.

Small mammals like rabbits and guinea pigs that live outside should not be

forgotten. If possible move them into a shed or outhouse. Covering the front of the hutch with a blanket can help cut out some of the noise and flashes of light.

If you require any more information about helping your pet, then just call and speak to either a Vet or Veterinary Nurse who will be happy to help.
